The Township Board encourages our residents to recycle. We have received many complaints from our residents stating their recyclables were being put in the garbage truck. To solve this problem and encourage recycling we have met with the garbage hauler and present our new policies here.

An 18-gallon recycle bin with lid will be available to residents for a nominal fee of \$7.00. Please place your items for recycling in the bins, separated by types. It's also a very good idea to put your name and address on the bin and lid. Additional bins may be purchased for \$7.00. The hauler will send a separate truck along the garbage route to collect these items.

- **Recycling Tips:**
- Make sure your recyclable materials are clean, dry and empty. Break down any cardboard boxes to ensure your container empties.
- Place any loose papers in a brown paper grocery bag before placing them in your recycling container to help prevent spillage.
- Do not use your recycling container for non-recyclables including grass and yard or food waste.

If it's not on the list, PLEASE RESIST



Newspapers Bundle securely with string, twine or put in paper grocery bag and place in bin. Newspapers **MUST BE DRY!**



Magazines, Catalogs, high gloss paper bundle securely with string, twine or put in paper grocery bag and place in bin. **MUST BE DRY!**

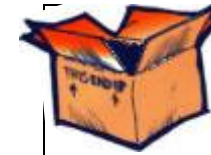
Glass - Clear, brown, and green glass bottles and jars such as food jars and beverage bottles. Wash thoroughly, remove caps & neck rings, place in bin.



NO Ceramics, coffee mugs, cookware, drinking glasses, dishware, light bulbs, mirrors, bottle caps, metal lids, fluorescent lights, electronic tubes, glass art, blue glass, or windows.



Metal & Tin cans, foil, metal caps, pie tins. Wash out, remove lids or caps. To save space, remove lids, place inside can and squash. Separate tin from aluminum cans. Do not place spray cans or cans containing paint or hazardous materials out for recycling.



Corrugated cardboard boxes and egg cartons, shoe boxes, dry food boxes (cake, cereal, crackers— remove liners). Broken down, no larger than 2 feet by 2 feet, securely bundled and placed in or next to recycle bin. Keep Dry! NO packing materials, bar soap or detergent boxes, pizza boxes, towel or tissue rolls, wax/plastic liners.



Phone books, paperbacks, hard cover books, brown paper bags. Remove covers and place in bin.



All plastic milk jugs, laundry jugs, food and pop bottles. Wash out, remove caps/lids and place in bin. NO plastic bags, motor oil or chemical containers, plastic cups, clear food containers or Styrofoam.



Mixed office paper, junk mail, computer paper, window envelopes. Bundle securely with string, twine or put in paper grocery bag and place in bin. Shredded paper must be bagged separately. All paper must be DRY.



Scrap Metal - small items only (i.e., baking tins, shovel). Separate and place next to recycle bin.
